September 15, 2016 minutes

The Louisa County Electoral Board met on September 15, 2016, at 10:30 a.m. in the executive board room of the county office building. Present were Mrs. Gilmer, Mr. Lewis, Ms. Driskill, and Mrs. Watkins.

Chairman Gilmer called the meeting to order and declared a quorum present.

Mrs. Gilmer made a motion to accept both the minutes of June 15 and July 14, 2016, as published. Mr. Lewis seconded; passed.

Concerns about parking at precinct #202 will be addressed with two plans. The helicopter pad will be taped off. Trained firemen will be asked to assist directing of parking in the unmarked parking lot.

Louisa town police will assist Precinct #201 voters to and from the Louisa Baptist Church parking lot and the Louisa Volunteer Fire Department Hall. The Louisa County sheriff and staff, as well as VDOT personnel, are aware of highway entrances and exits at Precincts #502 and #503. VDOT will bring flashing caution signs or a truck with a flashing sign to those precincts.

Mrs. Richardson, Adam Richardson, and Louisa County Parks and Recreation personnel will deliver voting equipment to all precincts on Monday, November 7, 2016, and mark the 40' prohibited area at each precinct.

The scanner in the Registrar's office used for in person absentee voting will be programmed at 2:00 p.m. on September 20, 2016.

The handicap accessibility to the entrance at Precinct #502 will be fixed by General Services if Mr. Jennings has not received a building permit by September 16, 2016.

The 36 high school seniors serving as pages will be given a vest to wear while they are on duty. The pages will return the vest to the precinct chief at the end of their shifts. These vests may be reused in future years. The Registrar and board would like to have the local school board recognize the pages for their greatly valued service.


The 65 people who had registered to vote as felons with restored voting rights were rescinded by order of the Virginia Supreme Court. Anyone who has this voting right restored by the governor as he takes case by case consideration will be required to reregister. The Registrar has currently reregistered 15 people. The state has sent a letter of notification, along with a voter registration form, to each previously registered felon. The Registrar will attempt to notify those who have not reregistered when the deadline is close.

There are eight standby names of people who have paper work on file. The board would like to have additional names.

Ms. Driskill read the board an email of appreciation received from an election officer. She also outlined the plan for the training sessions. Mrs. Gilmer and Mr. Lewis declared their schedules for training sessions and discussed the necessary content for the training they will conduct with the standby people.

The next meeting is scheduled for October 13, 2016, at 10:00 a.m. in the executive board room of the county office building.
