Call to Order

Health and Wellness Center of Louisa, Carrie Gladden

The Health and Wellness Center of Louisa (HWCL)

- Non-profit organization
- Provides primary care services: medical, dental, behavioral health, and medication services
- Cost-effective provider of care
- Discount for individuals <200% federal poverty level
- All insurances accepted
- A “one stop shop”- a place where everyone in the family can go for care
- Integrated primary care- referral between disciplines
- They see anyone- regardless of insurance status.

Who/What is The Health & Wellness Center of Louisa?

- Created in 2009
- Created to address poor access to primary care in the community for medically underserved
- Targets residents of Louisa, but anyone is welcome
- In 2013, HWCL saw 2,412 patients
 - Of those patients, 70% at or below 200% of the federal poverty level, 44% of patients 100% below federal poverty level, 50% uninsured

What We do

Address community health needs through:

- Chronic disease management
- Early detection of illness/disease
- Medication assistance as needed
- General dentistry
- Behavioral health- depression, anxiety, post-traumatic stress disorder

Why it matters

Illness is inconvenient

Potential for early disability

Unnecessary, unplanned hospital visits

Illness is expensive:

Missed time from work/school

Delayed entry into health care often means more expensive treatment

Employers lack reliable workforce

Behavioral Health Services

Loretta Mountcastle, Licensed Clinical Social Worker

Must be a current patient of HCWL

Sees patients with PTSD, anxiety, etc.

All ages and family counseling

Lowest cost is \$25, sliding scale based on income

Pharmacy programs- patients can receive 30-day supply for Medicaid \$3.75

Our Role

- Address community need through provision of primary health care services
- Done on individualized, personal basis with each and every patient under our care

- Board certified physicians (family practice and pediatrics), nurse practitioner, dentist, and licensed clinical social worker

Without health insurance? You may still qualify for assistance paying for health insurance through the Affordable Care Act now if any of the following apply to you:

1. Getting married or divorced
2. Moving to a new area
3. A change in immigration status
4. Having or adopting a child
5. Leaving prison, jail, or correctional facility
6. Loss of health coverage
